- Who are you doing?


### **Farewells**



Singular	you	are	you <mark>'re</mark>
Si	he she it	is	he's she's it's
Plural	you we they	are	you're we're they're

### Structure

- Affirmative sentence: Subject + verb To be + complement
- Negative sentence: Subject + Verb To be + not + complement
- Interrogative sentence: Verb To be + Subject + complement +?

### **Example**

- I'm student.
- She is not a model.
- Are they friends?

### Introducing a friend


